Synopsis: This Ordinance, if adopted, would amend Section 98.21(D) of the City of Huntington, Indiana's Code of Ordinances to reduce and clarify the notice requirements for applications for naturalized landscapes.

ORDINANCE 7-C-24

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HUNTINGTON, INDIANA BY AMENDING SECTION 98.21(D)

The Common Council ("Council") of the City of Huntington, Indiana ("City") in meeting duly assembled and upon information deemed by it to be sufficient, finds as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by Council that Section 98.21(D) is hereby repealed and replaced in its entirety with the following new subparagraph (D):

"(D) When an application for a naturalized landscape has been made, the Department shall schedule a public hearing before the Plan Commission and notify by mail all property owners who adjoin, or are within 200 feet of, the subject parcel. The Department may reasonably require mail notice to be given to additional persons. Notice of the public hearing shall be published at least ten days before the date of the hearing. The applicant shall pay all publication and notification costs."

BE IT FINALLY ORDAINED THAT, this ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its adoption and all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed.
