




Relocating the facility to 515 S 300 W would increase my travel time.



DROP-OFF RECYCLING SITE SURVEY


I will continue using or start using the facility at the proposed location, even if it's a farther drive, if it can help keep down operating costs and expenses.


I will continue using or start using the facility at the proposed location, even if it's a farther drive, if I know that recyclable materials will not have to be discarded due to contamination.

2.	Twice a month
3.	A couple of times a year, usually for cardboard boxes that are too large for curbside recycling or when I have lots of boxes after helping with a move.
4.	When i's necessary.
5.	Rarely / corrugated cardboard
6.	every couple of weeks
7.	I only use the facility if all of my recycling cannot wait to be recycled (holiday packaging, etc).
8.	bi-weekly for recycling
9.	Rarely use Park Drive facility, as I currently use the old landfill facility.

21.	Rarely, only when household bins are full or cardboard too large
22.	Every couple months
23.	Maybe once a year we use it if we have a buildup of boxes
24.	Seldom
25.	I used to use the Park facility weekly before recycling was added as a biweekly service for curbside pickup. I use the dropoff facility when I have an overage of items to recycle, or large items which will not fit readily in a bin such as flat-

tened cardboard boxes or large objects.

- 27. Never used. Didn't know I could living outside city limits
- 28. When I have more to recycle than will fit in my can.
- 29. For overflow recycling that gfl won't take because can is to full
- 30. When I have too much for my bin. Occasionally.
- 31. I use my recycle bin provided by the city when necessary. It's filled approximately once per month or less because of the limits of what can be placed in the bin.
- 32. When buying large objects like tvs, appliances and furniture. Not often but i's handy to take larger boxes than won't fit in bins during recycling pickup
- 33. I don't because it is too far and not open hours I would need it go be.
- 34. Occasionally if we miss our recycling pick up or have overflow. It is located very close to our home at this time.
- 35. Cardboard boxes or large amounts of paper when my bin cannot contain all of it. I might use it quarterly.
- 36. I use it very rarely because I pay for the place out of ft wayne to pick my stuff up.If you my bill in half and have them stop picking up recyclé items then I would my stuff to where ever
- 37. I don't. I use the Warren location but have used the current location once in the past.
- 38. I use it to recycle items too large to fit in my City recycling can. Also, I take recycling after filling my City can, which often occurs since we recycle a lot of household materials.
- 39. Some time
- 40. Whenever I have large quantities of cardboard that won't fit in my recycling bin. This would be about 2 to 3 times a year.
- 41. 2-3 times a month we take our recyclables in
- 42. Never use the facility
- 43. Every few months to drop off recyclables. Bins are usually full of non-recyclables so I don't go very often, plus fear of getting debris in my tires due to trash around bins.

- 78. I use the facility when I can. The recent change in operating hours prevents me from using the facility on a regular basis. The discontinued weekend hours have created the most hardship. I have had to resort to throwing away recyclable materials because I don't have enough space in my recycling bin, and there are no weekend hours at the current drop off facility. If the facility is moved, I will not use it at all, nor will I recycle more than my bin will hold.

- 1. I think it's a good idea to move it so that contamination can be monitored and prevented.
- 2. We as taxpayers spent a lot of money an a gate and concrete at Park Dr location. It was my understanding there was a long term contract before the improvements were made.
- 3. The majority of the people using the recycling will not drive that far
- 4. Great Idea!
- 5. I will not drive all the way to the former landfill to recycle. I will just throw it away.
- 6. I understand that several people who do use the present location have a hard time adhering to the present rules which are very simple. But I don't understand the reasoning for the moving of locations and the advantage that it is supposed to render. You just put in a very nice concrete pad to make it a cleaner and easier & experience, so why waste that? You need to make the process easier on the user, not more difficult. Moving it farther away will most likely force some local city residents to just throw all their recyclables in the trash vs. recycle. You might consider having separate containers for the highest recyclables, such as glass, aluminum, cardboard, and paper. These are the 4 largest products to be recyclable & most profitable. The latest changes you have made it much better so can't see the reason to change again
- 7. I'd be happy to pay for curbside pickup in the county is that something that has been explored? A minority of people take advantage of the "dumping grounds" and it hurts the majority. The new weekday only schedule already interferes with my ability to recycle adding an increased travel time would only limit it more.
- 8. I think it is a smart decision to take control of recycling drop off program
- 9. Cameras at current location and prosecute those that dump contaminated materials
- 10. I hope there will be no cost to recycle at the new location.
- 11. Cameras at the current location so people use these bends properly

- 25. We use this for our boxes from deliveries from the restaurant. We take truck loads at a time. It would be very time consuming to have to travel from downtown to the new location when we do it multiple times a week. If it moves we will just use our dumpster for boxes.
- 26. Consider a "hub" at the new location with "spoke" drop off sites throughout city/County for increased access with county pickup option, being relocation or if city access will most certainly lower the number of participating families in this program.
- 27. The restricted hours at West Park have made it difficult to utilize. I hate that people cannot use the facility properly but I may stop recycling if I am unable to get there before/after work hours. The Park Drive is a more convenient location and easy to use.
- 28. I think we shouldn't relocate the facility due to convenience of the location. With the recycling facility being at the Landfill on 300 the convenience of it decreases due to the location and the hours. If the recycling facility would to be relocated out to the landfill location then the hours SHOULD be more reasonable.
- 29. I really like the current location but it is really hard to get there with the new hours-going on Saturday was the most convenient
- 30. Live near Roanoke so it is already an inconvenience to recycle. It is apparent the we are of a small few in our neighborhood that do recycle. Making it so that we have to drive further will make it less likely that we will recycle at all
- 31. I agree over sight is needed. Folks see trash bins and think they can throw ANYTHING in them if not supervised. When I go throw recycling away, I see stuff that should not be in those trash bins. It is very sad when we expect our youth to follow directions, but us adults can't seem to do it. We have a big integrity issue around here. It's almost like "do what I say, not what I do" mentality in this world now a days.
- 32. - 33. Please don't move it
- 34. There needs to be a posted list online of what products are allowed and it they need to be separated.
- 35. I guarantee you that the people in town are not going to drive all the way to the landfill to drop off their recycling. I am on 600 W and it is way out of my way to go to the landfill to take my recycling, as I usually take it to West Park Drive when I go to town. Why doesn't GFL hire people to sort out the junk like Whitley Environmental did? That would make more sense. It would keep it more convenient for the people in the county and the city.
- 36. It seems incredibly inconvenient to move the drop-off location miles away from the population center of the county.
- 37. This proposal, in conjuction with more opportunities/times to drop off items such as large electronics, or even oils and paints, would be welcomed.
- 38. I like the short drive but if it improves the issues listed in the survey, I'm happy to drive a little farther. The current location seems to be used as a dumping site for anything and everything people want to get rid of. It's sad that some can't follow instructions and/or rules! - 43. Would love to see the drop off area moved
- 44. Too many times I have gone to drop off site and people are putting things there that do not belong like it's the public dump. A staffed facility would make everything easier.
- 45. Would be nice to still have in town site open once a month.
- 46. More travel time equals more gas which is not good for the environment so that cancels out the recycling. Also it would be be a greater burden for those of us on disability mobility wise and cost-wise. If the facility is moved my items will just be put in the dumpster instead of recycled. As I can no longer drive out of town the majority of my purchases are done online so I have a ton of boxes that I take to the recycling sometimes weekly sometimes twice a monthly but I always recycle all my boxes, glass, cans etc. But if it's moved 10 minutes out of town I won't be able to do that and I'll be forced to just throw everything in the dumpster. Even for people who are not on disability moving it that far out of town is going to be a lot more inconvenient. As busy as families are I think less and less will get recycled. So yes going to save money on the recycling part cuz less will be recycled but the environmental impact is going to be bigger and trash pickup costs will increase because more trash will be set out to be picked up then recycled. So NO cost savings you are just moving where the money is being spent! This is not a well thought out plan. Really dumb ideal.
- 47. Ultimately the site would have to be user friendly and easy in and out. I love having the recycling where it is and have accommodated for the varied hours because it's easy to get in and out. Not sure if this will hinder efforts of recycling for residents in city limits due to the increase in drive time. The residents in the county drive a long way anyways.
- 48. Having a drop off location on the north side of the county, where a majority of the countries residents live, would be nice, as well. The old landfill will take 20+ minutes for me to get there from my home. I pair my current trips to the recycling center when I'm already going into Huntington from Roanoke. In fact, I was just getting the cardboard and plastics around to do just that later this afternoon.
- 49. With the improvements to the current facility, concrete, fencing, it should stay until that money is at least recouped. Also, why not use the current containers, and have them specific, cardboard, plastic, glass, ect. It only takes a few extra seconds to put in different places. The current place is convenient for all residents of the county.
- 50. Hours weekend???
- 51. I wish gfl would allow us to use blue bags like our company before. I WILL NOT throw all of my recycling loose in my container at the curb just to watch all of it not to make it into the truck and blow around. The facility down at west park looks like a pig sty but at least it is contained in one area for the most part. We have cut down on what we recycle due to the fact I have to drive it somewhere once a week. At least in town I can do it while I am out running-f it is out in the country and out of the way I will quit recycling all together!
- 52. We need something available in each area of the county where recyclables can be dropped off. Unless you live in the town of Roanoke there is no place to drop off. I don't have the space to store recyclables and then haul them into the landfill or West Park location. I rarely come into Huntington. We live in Roanoke and work in FW.

- 53. If they are going to hire someone to be at the proposed site, why can't you hire someone for the existing site on Park Dr.? Since the proposed site out on 300W is out in the county will there be a charge to use it for recycling? It's too bad that a few people won't follow the rules at the recycling center & just dumps off junk that shouldn't be there!! One bad apple spoils the whole bunch very frustrating!!!
- 54. While we use the recycling center, on West Park Dr, on a monthly basis, the hours and days open has been an issue. While I work from home, a 30 min lunch doesn't allow a lot of time to swing by and drop of my recyclables during the week. We did this on Sat or Sun (after church) as it was convenient! The proposed new location is where recycling first started out and where I received my bins from! It's the same distance either way, but I'd drop off there knowing my recycling won't be placed in the landfill due to others putting their trash in with recycling.

- 60. Just curious if cameras etc will be used at either locations due to disposal of mon recycling items? Either location should have cameras to cut down on items being dumped that are not recyclable.
- 61. I like where it is at now, if you move it out to the other location I can see people dumping everything in there, I mean everything specially if no one there to watch people. I don't care if you have Cameras or not, people will dump their Garbage there. The location it is at now is very convenient for the older people. If your truly support your community then I say leave it where it's at now. If not people just going to stop Recycling plane and simple.

- 78. The inconvenient hours at the West Park Drive facility have caused less frequent drop offs of my recycling.
- 79. We take recycling to the West Park facility several times each week. Three minute drive.
 I'm sure many people drive pick-up trucks. When we take recycling, we don't top 30 mph. Going out to the landfill, people will drive 50+ mph, losing cardboard, paper, etc. all the way out there.
 Totally inconvenient. Bad idea. People will just overload their recycling bins as a result. GFL isn't gonna like that at all.

- 88. I live in 300w and had to endure all the trash for years and don't want to return to all the headaches of picking up others trash again. With all the expenses that has been done to the current location a big mistake to not keep using it.
- 89. Not a convenient location. Hope you don't plan on closing it again. Hope it would be open hours that people that work can get to it.
- 90. Changing the hours has dramatically dropped the amount of time we can use it. Having it available until dark would be exceptionally helpful.

- 91. I don't want to have to drive further to drop off recycling, but if you can offer better service at the proposed location, I am willing to make the drive.
- 92. It seems even if operating costs are lowered, the personal expense would be increased. I'm also not sure if the material that is turned in to the recycle center is actually recycled. It is common knowledge now that most recyclable end up as trash and is never actually recycled.
- 93. I think moving it out of the memorial Park location will cut down on the amount of personal trash that isn't recyclable.

- 95. The city has already taken away many of our "trash" options over the years. The elderly likely will not be able to drive to that location. I personally with the family/work lifestyle that I have will not use it. I think that most recyclable items will get thrown in the regular trash. - 101. Wondering what the status is on the Recycling program we have with the Bins we have at homes and where that goes-s it truly being recycled? How much of that has to be thrown away into garbage and how much is actually acceptably recycled? How much is it costing us? Can the 2 Recycling programs together be improved on?
- 102. I believe a lot of people will just put it in their trash.
- 103. Anything that can be done to prevent garbage from contaminating and thwarting the efforts of dedicated recyclers would be greatly appreciated.
- 104. I think it won't be used much at all if it is moved out there. Only a nominal amount of people the live in the county will increase their usage. Most that were driving it to town will just shift where they go. HOWEVER, MANY that use it in town will not use it any longer and further complicating the amount of actual garbage goes to the dump. - 114. I would not use the proposed recycling site. Reason number one is the extra 20 minutes total time for the drive. Reason number two is the added gasoline usage and associated emissions release would offset anything gained by delivering the recycled items. We are already paying a recycling fee every month in the City, and I'm not willing to take the extra time and expense to dispose a little recycling. Number three, with the city of Huntington having by far the most population concentration area in the County, it would only make sense to keep the recycling site as near as possible the that population concentration. It's a shame that, once again, the abuses by a few harms the many citizens trying to do the right thing. The answer is not to make it more difficult for these residents, but to stop the abuse. In conclusion, if this change is implemented, my excess recycling will go in the regular trash.

- 124. We live in north central Huntington County. We used to be able to drop off recyclables in Roanoke, five miles away. Now we have to drive 12 miles to the Huntington recycling facility (round trip uses one gallon of gas). Moving the drop off site farther away would be a hardship financially (over time) and dangerous in the winter (slick roads). We would probably just put all our recyclables in the trash, thus adding to the world's pollution.
- 125. I live closer to the proposed site so I am all for it!!

- 127. I think it is a bad idea to relocate.
- 128. I won't drive the extra time if moved. If I don't have room in my recycling bin then I will be throwing the stuff away.
- 129. Make it open on Saturday and sunday
- 130. You have cameras at the current location use them and stop punishing everyone
- 131. I will throw all my recycling into the trash dumpsters at my complex if the location moves. I dont have time to drive out of town. It's already a pain now since the weekend hours where taken away as I work 2 jobs to support my family and it's hard to get there now during open times during the week

- 133. Will the one at the old dump have the same hours of operation?
- 134. None
- 135. Needs to be open more hours
- 136. It often appears that the recycling I put out at the curb, in the green bin, is dumped in the trash truck and compacted to where they could not sort out the recyclables. Why is this done? I have seen them dump my recy Ling then crush it, and I hear glass breaking, etc.
- 137. Not everyone in Huntington has transportation &/ or the time or money to go that far.
- 138. If the proposed location will prevent people from leaving their old furniture and junk, I will use it. It makes me so angry when people leave their junk at the current location. Be responsible!
- 139. Having cameras!! Make people accountable for there actions if they are doing wrong out there! Punish them instead of everyone
- 140. Weekend hours would be appreciated. Making it from 8-5 during the week doesn't work for me.
- Moving it to the old landfill seems like a great idea
- 142. I like the location it's at now very conventional I use It alot I most likely won't use the service near as much if I have to go out to the old dump
- 143. I live not far from this and I strongly disagree with moving it to the land fill with high winds I don't want others TRASH blowing all around on our property. keep the Trash in town..
- 144. I'll be disappointed if the current facility moves because it's so handy and easy to get to, but understand that others are not using it appropriately which is disheartening.
- 145. I will absolutely, and unequivocally begin throwing everything in the trash and destroy this earth faster.
- 146. If the currently used site, in west park, was overseen like intended, and recycling picked up on a mote frequent basis, there would be no issue with its current location or overuse. I have frequently gone down there to utilize it, only to see it full, so i wait and return home. Returning 2 weeks later its still full, and overflowing because it still hasn't been picked up yet.
- 147. West Park is more convenient, gas prices are on the rise and moving location or not you will still find a need to increase the cost of the utilities bill which people have no choice but to pay.

- 148. I prefer relocation to the old landfill site versus shutting the satellite recycling location down completely.
- 149. Our recyclables bag fills faster than our trash bag. The farther drive will result in more trash and less recyclables.
- 150. Flexible hours is very much needed for people who work 7am-5pm. We understand the need to supervise what gets dropped off. Is there a chance you could post someone at the West Park Drive location? Thank you for asking.
- 151. "I am a meticulous recycler, have often wondered the cost/benefit of monitoring. Clearly, some people need to be monitored (is that a couch?) I thought the purpose of the current setup with fence and cameras was to monitor? Why is it that monitoring could be done at the landfill but not at the current fenced in area?"
- 152. Longer operating hours would be a huge help.
- 153. "1.Will this employ any number of people to keep the area clean. 2. Will there be weekend hours of operation. 3. Will there be cameras for security and safety. 4. What would be the cost to run the center."
- 154. I think the move would prove to be a good thing. Plus end up helping to better keep cross contamination from happening.
- 155. If we could have a Spring and or Fall clean up again that would be helpful. We would likely order a second recycle bin before we would go out to the proposed location.
- 156. Given that such a very low percentage of plastic actually get recycled in the US, any thing that could increase those percants would be welcome and wise.
- 157. Haven't been able to recycle as often due to the limited hours currently available
- 158. My problem is relocating to a place that will not be used as needed due to the distance of the proposed location and the rotten economy where every penny counts. The facility on W. Park is conveniently located in the middle of town, and easily accessible.
- 159. Where it currently is is a good location, esp for elderly people that recycle that won't drive out to proposed location. I take recycling from where I work as well as from my home-f it gets changed to other location, I will no longer be recycling
- 160. As a downtown business we are not offered curbside recycling. Moving this outside of the city will make it not only time prohibited, but not worth the hassle. We recycle a TON of glass bottles and cardboard, it's vital to our business to have it in town. We would no longer recycle if it's moved out of town.
- 161. I don't think it's a good idea. It is more convenient where it is currently located.
- 162. Question whether the materials are truly recycled or end up in land fill and would like to know more
- 163. I like the idea of overseeing what can be recycled and items that aren't recyclable. Park Drive recycle was always a mess.
- 164. Moving it to 300 W makes great sense if it will help stop a few individuals from discarding anything and everything and not following the rules. Recycling is very important for our environment and we need to do everything possible to keep it.
- 165. I agree with alot of the comments from the city (taxpayers) just spent an enormous amount of money a couple of times to have the recycle place on west park dr and it has not been there long enough to recoup the money for

that. Now you want to spend more money to fix the old landfill to even begin ur new endeavor. Maybe the city needs to think about how their decisions will effect the county taxpayers before they decide to even think about such a big change!! - 169. The current location of the recycling center works better for me and my family. Perhaps consider keeping the current center and having it open on weekends, but also open the other location as a second drop off center for those that live closer to that area.

- 182. I don't see any reason why the reasons for relocating can't be obtained where it is currently located. It is farther to obtain and with gas prices the way they are that's more money out of someone's pocket.
- 183. The debris "recycling" will increase the roadside trash. Blowing from vehicles even bagged. Scattering through fields just as before when the landfill was open. Being an eyesore, environmental hazard, plus putting the responsibility on landowners to clean up their property from the "City's "decision so they will will not have to be responsible for the clean up. Outside the city limits we pay dearly for our trash pickup. This will put additional finical strain on the County residents cleaning up dumped items whether accidental or intentionally. If the landfill "recycling" area is closed people will just dump along the roadside as they always have. The brush is already bad enough blowing out of non-covered trucks. - 185. Why not both? Keep the existing site open under restricted hours and offer the new site as a 2nd option.
- 186. We appreciate the every other week curbside recycle program & use it to its fullest capacity. We still need to take weekly trips or biweekly trips to the drop off center on Park Drive for larger boxes and pieces of cardboard. It would be very inconvenient to need to make regular trips out to 300 (costly in terms of time and fuel).
- 187. Please leave it at this location.
- 188. Instead of moving it to "prevent contamination" institute better policies at the Park Dr site. Also who is going to profit from moving the site and what will be done to the current site?
- 189. "1.New location not convenient.

- 190. I recycle as much as I can but cardboard fills our recycling can too quickly. It doesn't happen all the time but it happens often enough that driving out to the new location would be an inconvenience.
- 191. Saturday Drop off or open later .
- 192. I will stop recycling with the increased driving distance.
- 193. I forget about it.
- 194. Since I come into town, I use one of the trips to do recycling.
- 195. Please keep it where it is.
- 196. I like the current location better than the landfill but understand the issues.
- 197. If the hours get increased, that might work
- 198. Why move to the landfill, move the landfill to west park location. Remember the failure of the Pathfinders efforts,

they too ran into trash intermixed with recyclables which ended up in landfill. How about a pay to play with the drop off location via the same technology used by unmanned gym work out locations. There is tech that can confirm the user is allowed to use location.

199. "Consider NOT punishing all recycle users for the actions of a few.

Don't add staff at the former dump site. Instead, use that staff at the Park Dr. site and add more signage and cameras (real or fake) to help minimize contamination by individuals.

Costs were recently incurred to install cement in the Park Dr. facility. What benefit will taxpayers see if there is no longer a recycle site at that location?

Adding additional operating hours at the county site would incur additional costs. The way that each recycle bin is stuffed full each week seems to indicate full usage by residents now. Expanded hours would mean a need for more bins at more cost.

Many additional vehicles per month utilizing CR 300 would create more wear on that road and associated repair costs. Also, there would be a huge potential of ""littering"" of recycle materials along the road that gets blown out of vehicles. Who would clean that up consistently and what would the potential cost be?

Lastly, who is complaining about the contamination? The city or county? The recycling company? If it is merely the recycling company, the existing contract should have included a percentage of non-recyclable materials separation built in to their cost at the time of bid.

I would suggest that there be no change unless there is a breach of contract involved.

200. "I am concerned this will affect how many people will continue recycling. Some people will quit because it won't be convenient. People that live at the north end of the county and by Bippus and Roanoke will have a lot further to drive. This will keep some of them from recycling. I will keep recycling no matter what, but I probably will not recycle as much cardboard as I usually do.

The current location is more convenient than the landfill for a lot of people, because when you go to town to run errands it's easy to run by and drop the recycling off.

My question is whatever is being set up at the landfill, can it be set up at the current recycling location?"

- 207. I wish the facility didn't have to be moved, but I understand the reasons. What will be done with the current location of the recycling area?
- 208. Use one of the currently owned sites, such as the maintenance/street area, the sewer site off Waterworks Rd. All of these areas are staffed and open specific hours.

209. "I don't see how changing locations will stop contamination, people will still dump whatever all together. Has the State Environmental Board been informed or asked permission from, for the relocation? Will camera's be installed to prevent illegal dumping of items and animals? Will the funds received for the recyclables be used strictly for the recycling program??? Since the operation will be outside city limits, will county residents be supplied with recycling bins too, and at no cost like city residents??? If not, why not since money would be made from their recyclables too? Will there be an inspector hired to make sure laws and such are followed, unlike the landfill fiasco? Or will the residents be held responsible financially once again for the failures of the governing offices?
